Gum Boots/boots during summer are not necessary during the dry summer while slip on shoes and plastic sandals are not acceptable. Children wearing sandals or thongs will need to sit out at lunchtime and will not be able to play.

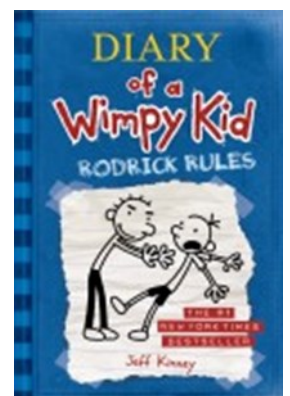

The Science Fair At Kapooka

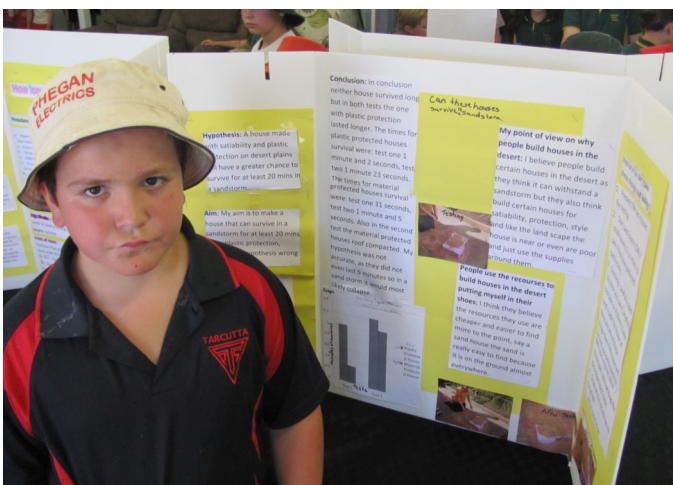

The crowd of students and the abundance of projects exceeded the event's expectations.



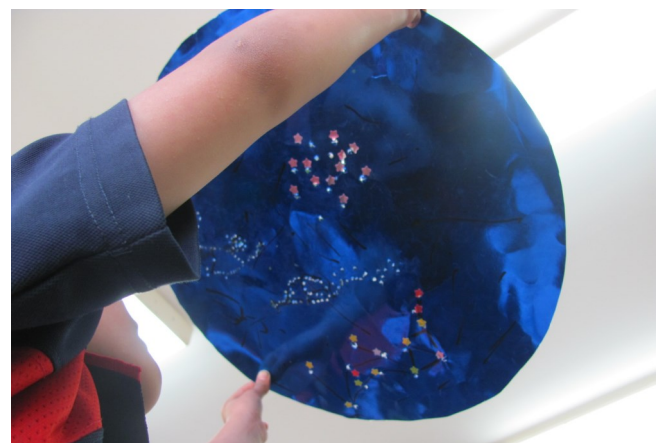
