'RUSS THE STORY BUS'

As part of the 2017 Children's Festival of Moving Stories, 'Russ the Story Bus' will be visiting schools in the Wagga region on **Tuesday 24th October**. We have been invited to attend Ladysmith Public School on this day from 1.00pm—2.30pm to participate in this program.

The program delivers author talks and creative learning opportunities to primary-aged students. Russ the Story bus is a mobile library and creative space. It offers students a unique environment to browse a library full of the latest children's books, read a favourite title, listen to an audio story and choose a book to take home. Students will also listen to a talk given by an author or illustrator on story telling.


"NO HAT, NO PLAY"

STEM SHOWCASE DAY


Dakota will be presenting her year-long science observations using the remote camera on Friday, 27th October. Her research into the wildlife and large animal life that visit the school has been surprising.
