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Child Protection Lessons

Over the next 5 weeks we will be completing our mandatory child protection lessons K-6. In these programs we look at keeping ourselves safe and who to turn to if we need help or are feeling scared. The Primary class will have one lesson where the body parts will be named. Primary Cyber Safety Lessons

We are in the process of organising a visit from our local Police Youth Engagement Officer, Troy Fisher. He will be running a transition program looking at educating our students of the laws surrounding cyber safety, bullying behaviour, assaults, graffiti, malicious damage and the Young Offender's Act. We will let you know when this is organised. As our students are spending more and more time online in programs like Minecraft and Among Us it is a good time for this conversation. Since our students aren't allowed to have social media accounts until they are 13, it is good to have these conversations before they start to use these programs.

Kindergarten 2022 Orientation Program

It has been an absolute joy to have our friends from Puggles join us for our Kindergarten Orientation program, many of whom will be starting kindergarten with us next year and some who will be coming in 2023. We have enjoyed seeing them in the 'big school' setting to see how well they are able to fit into the routines and lessons—just like they will have to when they start kindergarten. Tomorrow is our final orientation day for this year. Between now and when school starts next year there are plenty of things you can be doing with your child to help get them ready and we gave you a booklet with some ideas. Some other ideas

include:

- Reading every night to them and getting them to pretend to read back to you using the pictures as a guide.
- Writing their full name
- Practice writing their name on a keyboard (they will need to be able to type up their full name on the keyboard to access their laptops.
- Tying their shoe laces
- Colouring in
- Unwrapping their lunch
- Sitting with you to complete an activity and sticking at the activity (e.g. drawing a picture) - increase the length of the activity
- Know the names of the letters
- Count to 10 and backwards from 10
- Sing some nursery rhymes together
